Problem 1. Sketch the vector field $F(x, y) = (x - y)i + xj$ on the plane. (Here i is the unit vector along the x -axis and j is the unit vector along the y -axis).

$$F(x, y)|_{y=0} = xi + xj$$

$$F(x, y)|_{x=0} = -yi$$

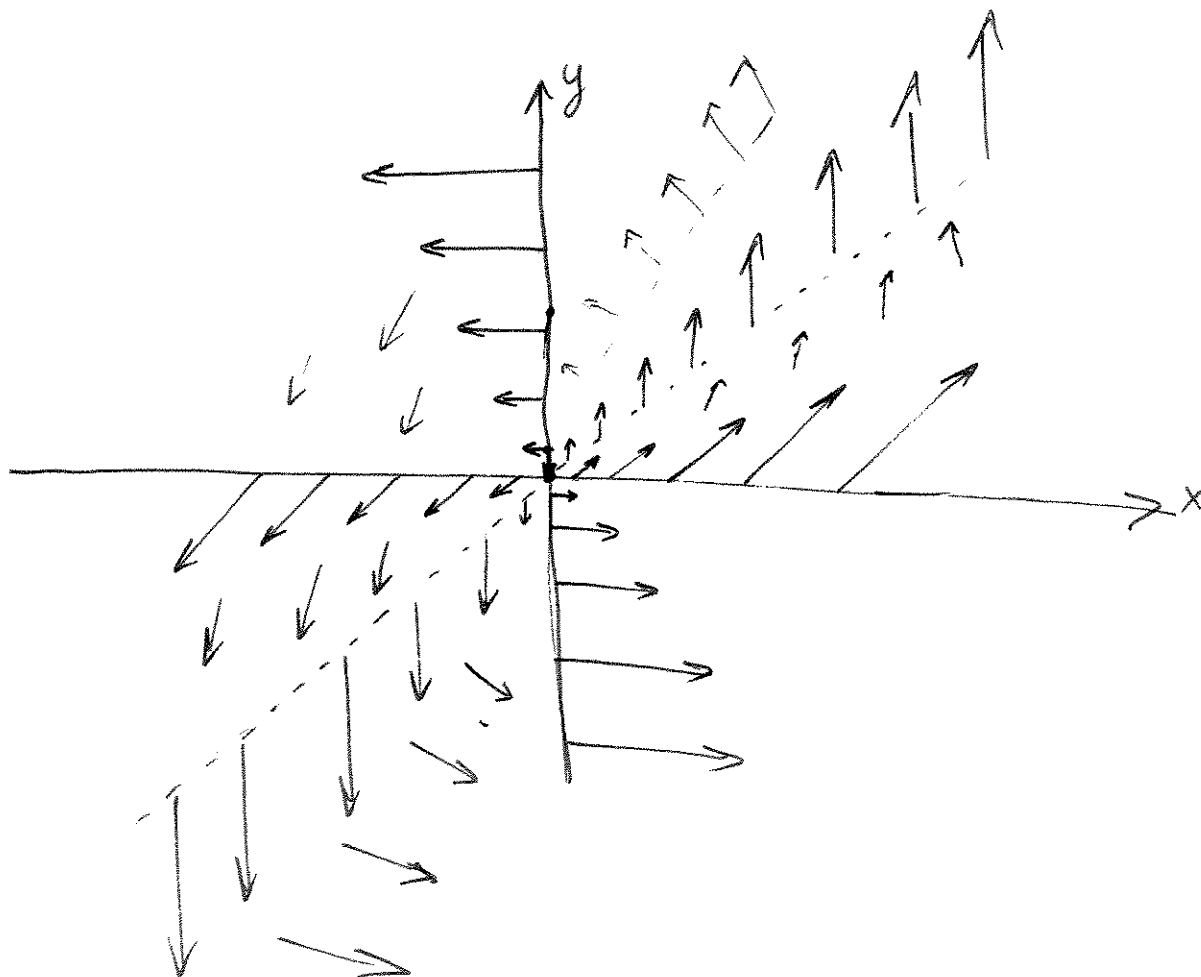
$$F(x, y)|_{x=y} = xj$$

$$F(x, y)|_{x-y=c} = ci + xj$$

constant

$$x - y = c \Rightarrow y = x - c$$

$$F(x, y)|_{y=x-c} = ci + xj$$



$$\textcircled{2}. \vec{F} = yz\vec{i} + xz\vec{j} + (xy + 2z)\vec{k}$$

Let $f(x, y, z)$ be such that $\vec{F} = \nabla f$.

$$\text{then } \begin{cases} \frac{\partial f}{\partial x} = yz & \Rightarrow f = xyz + g(y, z) \\ \frac{\partial f}{\partial y} = xz & \Rightarrow f = xyz + h(x, z) \\ \frac{\partial f}{\partial z} = xy + 2z & \Rightarrow f = xyz + z^2 + k(x, y) \end{cases}$$

$$g(y, z) = h(x, z) = z^2 + \underbrace{k(x, y)}_{0}$$

\Downarrow
both functions do not depend on x, y .

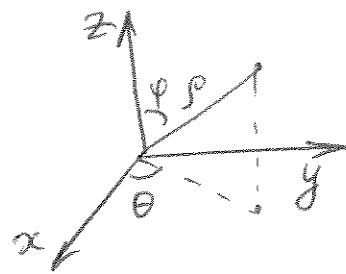
$$\Rightarrow \boxed{f = xyz + z^2}$$

$$(b) \quad (1, 0, -2); (4, 6, 3)$$

$$\begin{aligned} \int_C \vec{F} \cdot d\vec{r} &= \int_C \nabla f \cdot d\vec{r} = f(4, 6, 3) - f(1, 0, -2) = \\ &= (72 + 9) - (4) = 77. \end{aligned}$$

$$I = \iiint_E f(x, y, z) dV$$



$$= \left\{ (x, y, z) \mid \begin{array}{l} x^2 + y^2 + z^2 \leq a^2 \\ x^2 + y^2 \leq z^2 \end{array} \right\} =$$

$$= \left\{ (\rho, \theta, \varphi) \mid \begin{array}{l} \rho^2 \leq a^2 \\ \rho^2 \sin^2 \varphi \leq \rho^2 \cos^2 \varphi \end{array} \right\} =$$

$$= \left\{ (\rho, \theta, \varphi) \mid \rho^2 \leq a^2; \quad \tan^2 \varphi \leq 1 \right\}$$

$$\left. \begin{array}{l} \tan^2 \varphi \leq 1 \\ 0 \leq \varphi \leq \pi \end{array} \right\} \Leftrightarrow \begin{array}{l} 0 \leq \varphi \leq \pi/4 \\ \text{and} \\ 3\pi/4 \leq \varphi \leq \pi. \end{array}$$

$$\text{thus, } E = \left\{ (x, y, z) \mid \rho^2 \leq a^2, \quad \begin{array}{l} 0 \leq \varphi \leq \pi/4 \\ \text{and} \\ 3\pi/4 \leq \varphi \leq \pi \end{array} \right\}$$

$$\text{jacobian } \frac{\partial(x, y, z)}{\partial(\rho, \theta, \varphi)} = \rho^2 \sin \varphi.$$

$$I = \int_0^{2\pi} \int_0^{\pi/4} \int_0^a f \cdot \rho^2 \sin \varphi d\rho d\varphi d\theta + \int_0^{2\pi} \int_{3\pi/4}^{\pi} \int_0^a f \cdot \rho^2 \sin \varphi d\rho d\varphi d\theta$$

$$I = \int_C xy \, dx$$

$$C: \begin{array}{l|l} y = \sin x & x = t \\ 0 \leq x \leq \pi/2 & y = \sin t \\ & 0 \leq t \leq \pi/2. \end{array}$$

$$I = \int_0^{\pi/2} t \sin t \, dt = -t \cos t \Big|_0^{\pi/2} + \int_0^{\pi/2} \cos t \, dt = \sin t \Big|_0^{\pi/2} = 1$$

$$\begin{array}{l|l|l} u = t & du = dt & \cancel{u=t} \\ dv = \sin t \, dt & v = -\cos t & \end{array}$$

Green's formula:

$$\int_C P dx + Q dy = \iint_S \left(\frac{\partial Q}{\partial x} - \frac{\partial P}{\partial y} \right) dx dy$$

with $P = -y, Q = x$

implies

$$\frac{1}{2} \int_C x dy - y dx = \frac{1}{2} \iint_S 2 dx dy = \iint_S dx dy = A.$$
