

UCLA Center for Population Health and Health Disparities 2014 Summer Research Training Program Undergraduate Students- Application Form

THE PROGRAM

The UCLA Center for Population Health and Health Disparities is one of five centers funded by the National Heart, Lung and Blood Institute (NHLBI), National Institutes of Health. The UCLA Center works in East Los Angeles, a predominately Latino, urban community with high rates of obesity-related chronic diseases such as heart disease, diabetes, hypertension and stroke. The center has three health projects based in East LA that work towards the common goal of reducing cardiovascular disease risk among community members. Each summer, four dyads comprised of an undergraduate student and a graduate health professions student will be partnered with UCLA CPHHD investigators. Students will receive intensive one-on-one mentoring and will participate in seminars and workshops focused on health disparities research and policy, health professions preparation and training and career development, and they will be expected to write a report and present their work to the CPHHD investigators and at scientific and professional meetings.

PROGRAM ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA

- 1. Must have finished their first year of full-time coursework at an accredited four year university. If not a UCLA student, must provide proof of full-time student status.
- 2. Must be U.S. citizens.
- 3. Come from a community that is historically under-represented in the health professions, including individuals from an economically or educationally disadvantaged background
- 4. Must have strong interest in health disparities, cardiovascular health, Latino health issues.
- 5. Must be willing to work 30-40 hours per week for a 10 to 12 week time period in summer 2014, beginning week of June 23rd through August 30th (or longer term if doing 12 week program).
- 6. Willing to work on some evenings and occasional weekend hours depending on project's research needs during active data collection.
- 7. Must provide own reliable transportation with valid California license and automobile insurance.
- 8. Must be able to drive to various locations in East Los Angeles to participate in the various research projects and meetings.
- 9. Bilingual (English/Spanish) skills a plus but not required.

PROGRAM REQUIREMENTS

- 1. Minimum grade point average (GPA) of at least 3.0
- 2. Meet with assigned faculty mentor a minimum of once per week.
- 3. Attend CPHHD- weekly sponsored seminar.
- 4. Work 30-40 hours per week for 10-12 weeks. Must be available from week of June 24th through August 30th (time duration can be extended if doing 12 week program).
- 5. Must be available to attend meetings and activities in East Los Angeles community with community partners. (This requires that you provide your own transportation to and from East Los Angeles)
- 6. Must prepare and present scientific poster presentation at end of summer internship (September 23, 2014)

STIPEND

Students will be paid up to \$4000 for 10-12 weeks of full time work (*stipend will be pro-rated based on hours worked*).

SELECTION OF PARTICIPANTS

Participants are selected on the basis of statement of goals, aspirations and academic standing. Additional consideration will be given to demonstrated leadership, interest in Latino and health disparity research, cardiovascular research, and work experience.
