



2018 Summer School in Logic and Formal Epistemology

In 2018, the **Department of Philosophy** at Carnegie Mellon University will hold a three-week summer school in logic and formal epistemology for promising undergraduates in philosophy, mathematics, computer science, linguistics, economics, and other sciences.

This year will be co-located with the biennial **North American Summer School in Logic, Language, and Information (NASSLLI)**; in fact NASSLLI will comprise the third week of the summer school.

The goals are to introduce promising students to cross-disciplinary research early in their careers, and forge lasting links between the various disciplines. The summer school will be held from Monday, June 11 to Friday, June 29 on the Carnegie Mellon campus. Tuition and accommodations are free.
