
What is an Actuary?



- Business professionals who measure and manage financial risk
- Helps businesses deal with risk of loss by quantitatively measuring and qualitatively managing uncertainty
- Calculates the costs of uncertain future events that range from tornadoes and hurricanes to changes in life expectancy
- Uses math, data analytics, and business knowledge to study future events



Why Become an Actuary?



- Low stress
- High compensation
- Low unemployment rate
- High job security
 - No computer can replicate our work
 - Risk management is more important during economic recessions
- Balanced lifestyle
- Instead of paying for graduate school, advance your career through a series of employer-funded exams

Relevant Minors

Employers look for students with quantitative backgrounds. If your major is not as quantitative, it is a good idea to supplement it with a math-related minor.

Minor	Requirements (Excluding those necessary to declare the minor)
Mathematics (if not a math major)	5 upper-division math courses
Specialization in Computing (if not a Math of Computation major)	7 PIC and math courses
Accounting	7 management courses
Statistics	6 statistics courses

5.Actuarial Exams



Actuarial Exams

- Actuaries typically do not go to grad school
 - No more student debt! ©
- Instead, the actuarial career involves a series of ~10 exams
- It generally takes 5 10 years to complete (Achieving the fellowship level)





Actuarial Exams

- The two actuarial organizations, SOA and CAS, require the same two preliminary exams
 - Probability (SOA Exam P/CAS Exam 1) and Financial Mathematics (SOA Exam FM/CAS Exam 2)
 - Exam IFM replaced by module

Exam P – 3 hours MC*	Exam P – 3 hours MC
Exam FM – 3 hours MC	Exam FM – 2.5 hours MC
Exam IFM – 3 hours MC	Exam removed
Exam LTAM - 4.25 hours MC and WA*	Exam FAM – 3.5 hours MC
Exam STAM – 3.5 hours MC	Exam ALTAM or ASTAM – 3 hours WA



Actuarial Exams

- Firms typically require at least one passed exam for internship and fulltime positions
- Preliminary exams are 2.5 3hrs, multiple choice exams
- Recommended study time is 100 hours per hour of exam (250-300 hours)
- UCLA offers courses that cover both preliminary exams as well as more advanced ones!
