

- Actuaries provide data-driven insights and keep businesses safe by calculating the cost of uncertain future events.




WHY BECOME AN ACTUARY?

 - Advance through your career by taking employer-funded exams
 - Salary increases & bonuses with passed exams and more experienced

 - This could be interesting if you have an entrepreneurial side.



RELEVANT MINORS

Employers look for students with quantitative backgrounds. If your major is not as quantitative, it is a good idea to supplement it with a math-related minor.

Minor	Requirements (Excluding those necessary to declare the minor)
Mathematics (if not a math major)	5 upper-division math courses
Specialization in Computing (if not a Math of Computation major)	7 PIC and math courses
Accounting	7 management courses
Statistics	6 statistics courses

ACTUARIAL EXAMS

ACTUARIAL EXAMS

- Actuaries do not need to go to graduate school to progress in their career
 - No more student debt 😊
- Instead, they pass a series of professional exams, eventually ending up with a certification called FSA or FCAS (equivalent to CFA qualification)
 - ~10 exams total
- Completing all exams can take about 7-10 years for most
 - Associate Level → Fellowship Level



ACTUARIAL QUALIFICATIONS


FOR PROPERTY AND CASUALTY

- There are two main organizations that provide actuarial qualifications, which are the SOA and CAS.
- They both require the same preliminary exams
 - **Probability** (SOA Exam P and CAS Exam 1)
 - **Financial Mathematics** (SOA Exam FM and CAS Exam 2)
- After that, the exams differ by the organizations by their respective specialty.



EXTRA DETAILS ON ACTUARIAL EXAMS

- Firms typically require at least one passed exam for internship and full time positions.
 - However, note that it doesn't mean that more exams passed = better!
 - You need to balance it with TECHNICAL SKILLS and WORK EXPERIENCE.
- Preliminary exams are 3 hrs and are all multiple choice.
 - Recommended study time is 100 hours per hour of exam (250-300 hours).
- UCLA offers courses that covers the syllabus of the actuarial exams.
 - MATH 170E/S → Covers Exam P/Exam 1
 - MATH 177 → Covers Exam FM/Exam 2
 - MATH 178A/B/C → Covers Exam FAM
