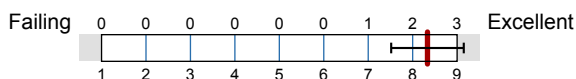

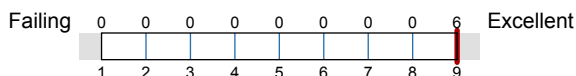

1.1) How would you rate your TA as an effective teacher?



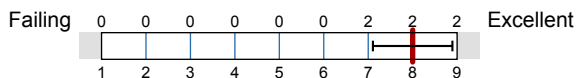

 - Raymond is really helpful outside of the classrooms as his office hours are really helpful (he goes through the thought process for questions in the homework that students are stuck in). His discussion sections were decent too, covering contents that are usually tested in the ADE qual which were not covered in lectures (this is helpful for me as a grad student; I'm not so sure how this translates to for undergrad students taking this class). A possible point to note is that he might want to pre-empt some of the difficult questions from the homework and prepare before office hours so that he would be more prepared in answering them!
